

The City begins its snow-plowing process once 4 inches of snow has accumulated, or as conditions may require.

Priorities

- Bus Routes and Sidewalks to Area Schools
- Primary Roads and Public Parking Areas
- 3) Secondary Roads
- 4) Alley-ways and cul-de-sacs
- 5) Continue sanding as needed

Snow Removal Policy, Contact Information, & Helpful Hints

Please Drive Safely

Please keep in mind that the City of Woodland Park has 55 miles of roadway, which will need to be plowed after each snowstorm. Your patience is genuinely appreciated.



The City's Streets Crew uses an average of 1,000 tons of salt-sand each winter.

Please remember to drive slowly and safely, using extra caution when you encounter snow removal equipment on the road.

The City's Streets Crews top priority is to consistently provide snow and ice removal services in a professional and proactive fashion.

Helpful Hints & Reminders

For home-owners with a gravel driveway, please don't plow across a public street.

Please do not park on the side of the road, or in the City's right-of- way. City Crews need room to clear the streets and sidewalks properly.

Snow that has been cleared from private property must be deposited in a ditch line, behind the sidewalk, or behind the curb and gutter.



When following behind a snow plow or sanding truck, please drive with your headlights on, and stay back far enough to remain clear of flying snow and sanding materials.

Please remember when plowing and clearing snow from your driveway or parking lot, do not plow snow from private property onto public streets or sidewalks.

Please keep garbage cans off the streets, so snow plows do not hit them during their plow route.

Please remind children not to play on the snow piles.

Occasionally, when plowing is required, snow berms may be created across driveways. Our crew members try to keep this to a minimum. However, removal of this snow is the responsibility of the property owner.
